Topics include how workers with developmental disabilities can identify and protect themselves from workplace hazards, what to do in an emergency, and how to speak up about a safety problem at work. Project staff created a version of the curriculum to support the Walgreens Disability Inclusion initiative to hire workers with disabilities in its new distribution centers. Walgreens trainees with disabilities take part in this course while they are learning to do their job in the company's training centers. Note: Lesson Three in this guide is "Staying Safe in an Emergency at Work."
